- Bid quickly and counter bid quickly bidding moves quickly in a live auction and there isn't a real advantage for holding off until the end to jump in you might miss the item!

Health Sciences Academy

Two years ago, Legacy introduced our Career Academies, giving students the opportunity to learn more about career fields they are considering. Since then, the program has grown and includes four Academies - Business and Entrepreneurship, Computer Science and Applied Technology, Leadership and Ministry, and Health Sciences.

The Health Sciences Academy is in its second year, and is geared towards students who are interested in biological sciences and have an interest in pursuing careers in a health related field such as Nursing, Physical Therapy, Physician Assistant, Veterinary Medicine, and similar fields. Students in the program take Anatomy and Physiology as a junior and Medical Terminology and Pharmacology as a senior. During these two years of study, students learn different organ systems, specific pathophysiology, and the proper use of pharmacology. Students also experience applicable hands-on learning, allowing for deeper understanding and real world application.

By allowing students to take a shallow dive into these courses, students are prepared for the curriculum they would experience in college. Not only does the program prepare students for the next level of learning in health sciences, it also allows students to recognize their level of interest in continuing to pursue this path of education. We are excited about the future of the program and look forward to seeing it continue to grow!
