

Audience members enjoyed the show by sitting on stage, surrounding the actors in a "theater in the round" seating arrangement.



Meet Melissa Merritt! Melissa attended Legacy when it was known by the name Xenia Christian Day School. She began attending the school in 6th grade when her family moved to Xenia and her mom began teaching at the school. Melissa shares that she got to see the teachers live their faith authentically in the classroom and outside of it at XC/LCA because of the community feel of the school. Along with a mission trip she went on through the school, the authenticity of teachers helped her learn how to put her faith into action. The teachers at the school also helped her learn that God sees her and knows her intimately and personally. These lessons have stuck with Melissa since she graduated.

Following her graduation in 1996, she attended and graduated from Cedarville University, where she also met her husband. After graduating from college, Melissa began working as a nurse in
